From the President's Desk

First of all, I would like to send my deepest and sincere sympathies to the family of Mr. and Mrs. Karl Bretschneider for their recent loss. Our thoughts are with them during these trying times. Any words of comfort I can give at this time would be that the hurt from this loss will fade as time goes on, but the memories will live on forever.

I would like to express my regrets at the loss of Dawn Woda who recently resigned from her position as Trustee. Dawn has served this community well and will be missed. I wish her nothing but the best in the future.

Taking Dawn's position as Trustee is Mike Heili who will serve the balance of Dawn's term which expires April of 2006. Mr. Heili was appointed to that position by the Board of Trustees at the September 9th meeting. Mr. Heili was the only resident who applied for the position. My personal thanks to him in his desire to serve the Village of Newburg.

In my articles in future publications of the Bridges, I will convey to you, the residents things that you may not be aware of including events and Village ordinances.

It has been brought to my attention that there is a concern about frying grease being discharged into the sanitary sewer system. We ask for your help and cooperation in eliminating this matter because it does create serious issues at the plant and this does cost money to make repairs.

There is a burning ban in effect for the Village of Newburg, Town of Trenton and Town of Saukville until further notice. If you have any questions, please contact the Village office at 675-2160.

A couple other items you as residents of the Village of Newburg may not be aware of are the following:

1. Ordinance 9.15 – It states, “it is unlawful for any child under the age of 18 to loiter idle or remain upon any street or alley or other public place in the Village of Newburg between 11 p.m. at 6 a.m. the next day. This is an ordinance that is on the books. Thus, it must be enforced by our Law Enforcement Officers.

2. The Village of Newburg is in the process of establishing an Emergency Government Committee. Its function will be to give direction and assistance to residents of the Village of Newburg in case of an emergency. This committee is headed up by Emergency Government Director – Gene Neils. You will be seeing information in the Bridges and other communications as to their goals and operations.

One of the most important committees serving the Village of Newburg is the Planning Commission. This committee is made up of three residents, two Board members, the Building Inspector and the Village Engineer. They are responsible for the future development of this community. Your input as residents is very important. Their meetings are held the first Thursday of each month at 7 p.m.

I will continue to hold office hours on Friday evenings from 6-8 p.m. If I am not available, a notice will be posted at the front entrance.

Please note that the burning ban for the Village of Newburg has been lifted as of 9/21/05. BUT the burning ban still remains in effect for the Town of Trenton and the Town of Saukville. Any questions on this, please call the village hall at 675-2160.

Emergency Government

The Village of Newburg’s newly formed Emergency Government Committee met recently. In the event of a declared state of emergency concerning the Village of Newburg, the Village-wide warning siren will be activated. The siren will have a steady tone for a period of 3-5 minutes. When this is heard, this is a warning to “take cover.”

In order to make sure the warning system is functioning properly, the siren will be tested on the first Monday of every month at 11 a.m. It is recommended that all residents, schools and businesses practice their emergency plan during this time.

In the event an evacuation is necessary, the two main shelters are St. John’s Lutheran Church, 632 Congress Street and Holy Trinity Catholic Church, 521 Congress Street. St. John’s is equipped to handle wheel chairs and also has an elevator. There will be Emergency Government personnel and volunteers at these locations to assist people.

Anyone who lives with or knows of a person with special needs that would require assistance, please notify the Director of Emergency Government, Mr. Gene Neils (675-0642) or the Village office (675-2160), so that individual’s name can be put on a list for us to respond to.

Pets are NOT allowed in the shelters. Autumglow Pet Lodge, W4702 Highway A, Fredonia (692-9797) will be able to assist you with this.

If you have any questions, please contact Emergency Government Director Gene Neils at the number listed above.

First of all I would like to take this time to send out a thank you to former public works employee – Bill Gross. Bill put in a lot of hours on Saturdays, late nights up plowing and even a couple of 12-hour days plowing the village streets. I enjoyed working with Bill and he will be missed by the Village of Newburg, the Board, Village employees and myself. Thank you, Bill, for a GREAT JOB!

Updates for the Village of Newburg in 2005: We spent quite a bit of time in Dr. Weber Park this year. We fixed up the tennis court surface, replaced the net, and repaired the benches. We replaced the old wood bleachers with a new aluminum unit, and we will be adding another in 2006. The garbage cans were also replaced with very nice looking receptacles, most of the trees we added mulch to the bases to help keep them moist and for a nicer look in the park. We plan to keep improving the park with newer items throughout 2006. We will also be adding some new picnic tables in 2006.

Almost all of this year's street projects are finished. This year we crack filled the south side of the Village streets and the public works garage and also seal coated the area. Hickory Road was boiler slag seal coated as a maintenance project to extend the life of the road and to replenish the black surface which helps in winter melting. Sidewalks were replaced on half of Main Street this year and this is going to be a project we are looking to do portions of the village every year. We also spray patched portions of Franklin, Congress, Salisbury and Main Street where there were problem areas. The only street

project left to be done is some Infra-red patching of manholes and low spots on the roads before winter plowing begins. This helps reduce damage to the plows and manholes.

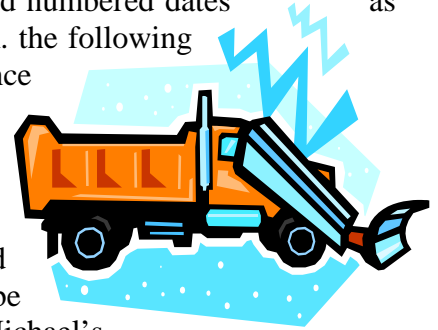
We are also starting something new for the Village of Newburg residents this year – a fall clean up dumpster. The village will be able to provide three 30-yard dumpsters this fall to help residents with cleanup of your unwanted items. The project started September 24th and will run through October 22nd or until the last dumpster is full. We are only getting 3 total dumpsters. This is something we are looking to keep doing and maybe doing this in the spring as well. Snowmobile Trails

Snowmobile season is right around the corner and HOPEFULLY – THE prediction is for lots of snow. The trails are usually open if there is 6 inches of snow or more. For the hot line, please call 334-6061 to see if the trails are open or not. Please observe the trail boundaries and don't go outside them. People grant the club permission to ride the trails – don't abuse this. Also – a new trail through the village is being worked on. With the new street & sidewalk construction – we don't want this all tore up with the carbides on the new snowmobiles.

Snow Emergency Parking

From November 1st to April 1st, except on Main Street (CTY. MY) parking shall be permitted only on the even numbered sides of the streets on even-numbered dates as of 11 p.m. the previous night to 6 a.m. the following morning and on odd numbered dates as of 11 p.m. the previous night to 6 a.m. the following morning. Violations of this ordinance will result in a \$25 ticket. If the vehicle has not been moved within 24 hours, the vehicle may be towed away and the owner will be responsible for towing (\$55) and storage costs. The vehicles will be towed to Goeden's Auto Body in St. Michael's.
