General Election

Voting hours for the November 8th election are 7:00 AM until 8:00 PM.

In-Office absentee voting begins on October 24th at 9:00 AM and ends November 4th at 5:00 PM. The last day to register to vote is November 4th at 5:00 PM.

Trustee Resignation/Appointment – John Beimborn Sr. recently resigned his position as Village Trustee. Bill Cording, a former Trustee and Village Clerk, with over 25 years of service to the Village, was appointed to complete John's term which ends in April of 2017. Welcome back Bill!

New Employee – Christin Brynwood has been hired as the Village's Accountant and appointed as Deputy Clerk. She will be handling the village's financial record keeping including the utility billing, real estate tax billing and receipts, pet licensing, accounts payable, payroll as well as the Bridges newsletter. She will also be assisting with the elections and resident inquiries. We look forward to Christin's service to our community. With that said, I will be taking on the position of Village Treasurer.

Dog Licensing – all dogs kept within the village limits MUST be registered with the village. State requires such to verify that all dogs have been vaccinated for rabies. The registration renewal application notice will go out to current dog owners mid to late December.

Sanitary/Utility Billing - all unpaid sanitary bills as of November 1st will be forwarded to the County Clerk. These unpaid bills will be added to the real estate tax bill for collection. The Village is not allowed to collect these payments after the November 1st date. This is in accordance with state law.

Please be reminded that payments for sanitary billing can only be made at the Village Hall. Payments can be made in person from 9-5 Monday through Friday, or by mail, or put into the Drop Box at the Hall. Payments that are mailed will be credited as of the post marked date, and payments put into the drop box will be credited as of the previous business day.

Please include a self-addressed, stamped envelope if you would like to receive a receipt for your sanitary bill. If you have any questions, please call the Village Hall at 262-675-2160.

Trash Pickup – we have received several phone calls from residents regarding the village's waste hauler picking up recyclables at the same time and with the same truck as regular trash. Please note – Advance Waste now has a truck with 2 separate bins allowing for segregated collection and hauling of both types of waste. The recyclables are NOT mixed with the regular trash for dumping.

Recycling – Fall Clean Up Dumpster will be available starting September 28th and all 4 weeks in October. Hours of operation will be Wednesdays from 5 PM – 7 PM and Saturdays from 9 AM – 12 PM at the maintenance building on Municipal Drive. The open dumpster is there for your use. However, we do prohibit the disposal of paint, electronics, batteries and tires. Please do not abuse the system by disposing of these prohibited items.

Brush Pick Up – residential roadside brush pick up will end the fourth Saturday in October.

Village Hall Holiday Hours – Holiday closures for the Village Hall will be November 24th and 25th all day, December 23rd & 26th all day; and December 30 from 1:00 PM – 5:00 PM.

Village Code – a recent change was made to village code regarding zoning, specifically the size and the number of accessory buildings allowed in various zoned districts. As noted in a previous newsletter, the Village of Newburg municipal code is now online and has a very easy to use search engine. If you have a wood-burning fireplace make sure you have it cleaned or clean it yourself and check for any obstruction.

The Newburg Fire Department will be hosting an open house. October 8, 2016 from 10 AM to 2 PM. Watch extrication demos at 12 noon and a live burn demo at 1 PM. The kids will get a chance to spray water from a fire hose, receive fire prevention goodie bags and try on firefighter gear. It's Fall in Newburg, raining, damp, chilly and just a little bit depressing. So what better time to talk about your health insurance! (lol)

For everybody on Medicare, the annual enrollment period starts October 15th, 2016, and runs through December 7th. Any changes that you make at this time will be effective January 1st, 2017.

Agents can start marketing the new products on October 1st, but no agent or company can actually fill out and take an application until the 15th.

Co-pays, deductibles, pharmacy networks, and most important, formularies change, so it is always in your best interest to shop your coverage at this time of year to make sure that you have the best plan for your needs and budget.

For all of you with ACA/Obamacare regulated plans, there are some significant developments. The enrollment period for you to make changes to your coverage runs from November 1st, 2016, and runs through January 31st 2017. In order for new coverage or any changes you make to your account to be effective on January 1st, 2017, you must make these changes before December 15th, 2016.

As of today, three major companies will be pulling out of the individual (under 65) marketplace, and will no longer be offering plans.
