With the snow storm on Monday March 13th the Village issued a snow emergency. This was decided after conferring with several Village officials who felt it was best due to equipment problems we were having, and with how much snow they were forecasting for the morning of the 14th also.

There are address changes coming and renaming of Main St. This is being done first of all for the safety of the residents. I believe that there are 30 addresses just on Main St. with a conflict with the same address and zip code in West Bend. This can be a nightmare for all safety personnel. I need to thank Trustee Strohmeyer for all the hard work she put into this finding all the conflicting addresses. Also thank you to Chief Yanke and zoning Administrator Grotelueschen for all their hard work on this also. There will be more about this in other articles in the Bridges.

I had a broken cover on my garbage receptacle. I called Advanced Disposal at 1-800-387-0949. This phone number is on the collection schedule you were mailed. They came out in a few weeks and replace the broken cover. If you have the same problem give them a call.

The Parks commission lead by Trustee Juech has been doing just an outstanding job. They have been very busy planning things for the Parks and possible activities for the Village.

Chief Yanke continues to help the Board getting our Ordinances up to date and enforceable. The added hours of Police patrols in the Village are welcomed.

Request: please help us keep Newburg looking its best. If you see trash in the ditch line, especially on windy trash collection days, lend us a helping hand and pick it up. Your assistance is greatly appreciated.

With warmer weather approaching please be considerate of your neighbors with your burn piles. Local ordinance prohibits the burning of any garbage or trash within village limits.

At the March 9th Village Board meeting, the Board voted to rename Main Street/County Highway MY and issue new house/building numbers to several of the buildings on this street. These changes were made primarily to allow for better response to emergency service calls as well as having accurate mail delivery. This change will also put the Village in compliance with state and federal voter registration. These newly assigned addresses will no longer be in conflict with similar addresses in the City of West Bend. Effective May 15, 2017 Main Street/County Highway MY from the Washington/Ozaukee County line west to the village limits will now be named West Main Street. South Main Street from the Washington/Ozaukee County line east to State Highway 33 will now be named East Main Street.

Letters in regards to this change with additional detail are being mailed to each individual property owner on Main Street/County Highway MY. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact Village Hall at 262-675-2160.

This past quarter the Village Board passed an ordinance in regards to the definition of temporary structures and their use. Temporary structures include dumpsters, polystructures/carports, and portable storage structures. A copy of this ordinance, No. 02-2017, is available at Village Hall as well as online via the village website code of ordinances link. An ordinance establishing the regulations for the use of temporary structures, No. 03-2017, is also available for review at Village Hall or online. Another ordinance recently adopted, No. 04-2017, establishes new winter parking restrictions in the Village. It is as follows: "Winter parking regulated. November 1 of each year to April 1 of the following year, parking shall be permitted only on the even-numbered sides of the streets on the even-numbered dates as of 11:00 P.M. the previous night to 6:00 A.M. the following morning and on odd-numbered sides of the streets on the odd-numbered dates as of 11:00 P.M. the previous night to 6:00 A.M. the following morning." Please pass these new parking restrictions on to any visitors or guests who may be parking street-side overnight in Newburg.

One last note, as to village property assessments Open Book will be held at Village Hall on May 3rd from 3 to 5 P.M. Board of Review will follow on May 30th from 6 to 8 P.M.

Police News

I think I am probably speaking for most of you, WELCOME SPRING. It has been an interesting winter. We informed you in our last Bridges about the new parking ordinance that will be adopted along with the possibility of utilizing a "Snow Emergency" to help the DPW clear village streets. We didn't expect to use the "Snow Emergency" quite so soon. The responsibility of knowing a "Snow Emergency" has been declared is on the resident. We will post the information on all local TV news outlets, those being 4, 6, 12 and 58. We will also post the information on both the Village web site and Police Department Facebook page. If we get 4 or more inches of snow, please check those venues to see if a snow emergency has been declared. Once declared, there will be no parking on any Village street. We will clear the Village Hall parking lot as soon as possible making parking available for residents and visitors. We ask that you please call and advise us of your name and phone number in case the vehicle would need to be moved for an emergency. The other option for parking would be to get permission from any private property owner to park on their property. We hope that this will not be done too frequently in the future but in circumstances like what happened on the 13th, we had no other choice. We have added a part-time administrative clerk to the department. That person will be assisting with data entry and office responsibilities within the department. We process over 70 bartender applicants at this time every year which takes numerous hours. I am also working on a

grant to hopefully purchase a portable speed limit sign to display the vehicle speed as it passes the sign. We plan on having at least three locations in the Village that we will be posting these signs. I am hopeful we receive the grant by the end of the year. I am also in the process of reviewing all the signage in the Village. If you notice any stop or parking signs that need to be replaced, please let us know. If you have any questions or concerns, please stop in and see an officer or stop one of them when they are on patrol. Enjoy the upcoming spring weather. Scott

Riveredge Nature Center

The Village of Newburg is partnering with Riveredge Nature Center, Milwaukee Riverkeeper, Southeastern Wisconsin Watersheds Trust, Milwaukee Metro Sewerage District, and Ozaukee and Washington Counties to launch the Community Rivers Project (CRP) this spring/summer. The CRP aims to improve water health and quality within the upper Milwaukee River watershed by working in conjunction with citizens of all ages, elected municipal officials and stakeholder groups to inspire, inform, and enable individuals to effectively plan, design, and build projects that will reduce nonpoint source pollution to the Milwaukee River. The program will offer community-wide, adventure based programs (free small-group kayaking trips on the Milwaukee River departing from Newburg), a community festival, one-on-one water quality testing, storm drain stenciling, educational programming, onsite property consultations to establish landscape opportunities (such rain barrels, rain gardens, prairie gardens, vegetation buffer strips, etc.). In addition, the Village of Newburg will receive "Healthy River Community" signs that will be posted throughout the Village to recognize their commitment to the Community Rivers Project. This program is intended to serve as a model that is replicable in additional communities' throughout the Upper Milwaukee River and will further improve the health of the river in future years.

- May 12 - Spring Identification and Management of Native & Invasive Species
- May 21 - Community Rivers Kayak
- July 9 - Rain Barrel Workshop

Electronic Waste (E-Waste)

Wisconsin's electronics recycling law bans the landfilling and incineration of several types of electronics. These bans apply no matter where the devices are from or who used them. Residents are prohibited from placing these items out for collection at the curb. Wisconsin households can recycle banned devices (except cell phones) through E-Cycle Wisconsin. More information can be found at: dnr.wi.gov/ecyclewisconsin.

E-Waste Banned from Landfills

- Desktop computers
- Desktop printers, fax machines, scanners and copiers
- Video display devices of at least 7" in the longest diagonal dimension. These include TVs, laptops and computer monitors.
- Computer peripherals including keyboards, mice, hard drives, scanners, speakers, flash drives, external modems
- DVD players, VCRs, DVRs
- Cell phones

Why Recycle?

Electronics that are landfilled, incinerated or illegally dumped can release toxic materials like mercury, lead and cadmium into the air, water and soil. Recycling ensures that these materials are reused safely or disposed of properly. Many electronics contain valuable, reusable

materials like gold, steel, silver, copper and glass. Recycling old devices reduces the need for new materials and cuts down on greenhouse gas emissions associated with manufacturing.

Newburg E-Waste Collection Event

The Village of Newburg will host an electronic waste collection event for Village of Newburg residents only on **Saturday, May 13, 2017 from 9:00 A.M. to 12:00 NOON**. Bring your undamaged TVs, computer equipment and other E-Waste to the village maintenance building at 3590 Municipal Drive.

Data Security Concerns

Before recycling a computer, it is important to remove all personal or confidential information. Many retailers offer this service for a small fee.

Newburg Recycling Hours

Second and fourth Saturday of each month from 9:00 A.M. to 12:00 noon. Bring waste oil, brush, and cardboard only for disposal. E-Waste, TVs, furniture and appliances are **NOT** accepted. Violators dumping unaccepted items will be prosecuted. Note: Goodwill in West Bend will accept undamaged flat screen TVs at any time even if they are inoperable.

Newburg Brush Collection

The 2017 curbside brush collection dates have been set for May 27, June 24, July 22, August 26, September 23, and

October 28. Note: brush must be clean branches/brush – no construction lumber/landscape timbers accepted; set materials curbside with cut end facing street; materials must be less than 6 inches in diameter, with a length less than 6 feet.
