Dog Licensing: All dogs must be registered per State Statute 174. You have from December 15 through March 31 each Year to obtain a Dog License without penalties. As of April 1 of each year, any dogs licensed after that date will be charged a \$25 late fee by the Village of Newburg. The late fee will be charged per dog. Exception is if the dog is less than 5 months old, no late fee is assessed, or the dog owner(s) have recently moved into the community. Further State penalties apply if determined noncompliant.

The Village Hall is open Monday through Friday from 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. Dog Licensing Applications may be picked up at the Village Hall. Completed applications can be mailed to the Newburg Village Hall, P.O. Box 50, Newburg, WI 53060-0050, or dropped in the Drop Box attached to the Village Hall Building anytime day or night. In addition to the completed Application Form, you will need to provide a copy of the rabies certificate for each dog you are licensing. If you require a Receipt or return of Dog License, you **must** include a Self-Addressed Stamped Envelope, or pick up at the Village Hall Office.

If you are moving out of the Village, or no longer have the dog(s), you must notify us to update our records.

TAXES: Second (2nd) Installments are **payable to the County**, NOT the Village, and are due July 31st.

With **Veterans Day** quickly approaching, you may want to consider purchasing a Legacy Stone to be placed around the Veterans Memorial in Freedom Park in Newburg for any

Active Duty Military, Honorably Discharged Living or Deceased Veteran. See attachment to this Newsletter. Please allow 6 weeks (Due by September 30th) advanced notice to get the Legacy Stone installed in time. Veterans Day is November 11.

Eastern Shores Library Bookmobile. See the attached schedule and Summer Library Program toward the back of the Newsletter.

Reminders: The Village Hall will be closed in honor of Independence Day on Monday, July 4. Advanced Disposal will be picking up Trash and Recycling on Friday, July 1.

SANITARY PAYMENTS: Any payments received are applied to the outstanding Invoice(s) first. Then applied to current Invoice. If you require a Receipt or return of the portion of the Invoice, you **must** include a Self-Addressed Stamped Envelope, or pick up at the Village Hall Office.

All open Invoices after the 15th of the Due Date are assessed a 10% Penalty and compounded quarterly on any Unpaid balances. **Any UNPAID balances after November 1 are placed on tax roll for collection.**

Greetings from Little Village Insurance Agency,

We hope that everyone is having a wonderful spring, but now that school is out, please keep your eyes peeled for children in the streets and crosswalks. The speed of the traffic in town can get pretty fast sometimes, so please be extra careful when you are rushing to work in the morning or on your way home in the afternoon.

As far as health insurance goes, the biggest news at this time is that the largest health insurance carrier in the United States will be pulling out of the individual health insurance market due to ½ billion dollar losses the past couple of years. In 2017, United Health Care will no longer sell individual plans in all but a couple of States.

If you have one of these plans, you will have to find new coverage for 2017. If you have a Grandfathered plan, your coverage will be effective until December 31st, 2017. If you need help finding new coverage, please contact us this fall during the Annual Enrollment Period (Nov. 1st 2016-Jan. 31st 2017).

There is another major carrier that is thinking about pulling out, but it's not official, so we can't name them at this time.

We haven't heard what the rate increases will be like next year, but Anthem in TX, has requested a 60% rate hike because they also have lost approximately \$500 million a year for the last three years. That increase hasn't been approved yet, and we don't believe the remaining carriers here in WI, have been losing as much money, so hopefully we won't see that type of increase.

The main reason these companies are losing money is the government has been granting exemptions (from buying insurance) to people so they don't get a penalty, but in the middle of the year, they get sick and they go buy insurance. There are rules that are in place to prevent people from buying outside the enrollment period, unless they meet certain requirements, but the government has not been enforcing these rules. United Health Care warned the Federal Government, but nothing was done so they pulled out.

The Medicare Annual Enrollment Period is the same this year. It runs from October 15th through December 7th. Agents and companies can start marketing plans October 1st, so until that date, we really don't have official information on the new products. Please contact us this fall if you need help shopping your present coverage. There are no charges or fees for this service.

Summer camps at Wellspring are focused on outdoor fun and connecting kids to where food comes from. Each session includes activities based on gardening, farming, animals, nature and outdoor play! Kids will have great time on a real working farm. This year, we're offering 1-day mini-camps for kids between the ages of 6-13. We have an overnight camp for kids, ages 8-13. AgriCorps is our program for teens, ages 14-17.

Sprouts (ages 6-9) Day Camps

Individual Day Camps (8 am- 5:30 pm) -- Cost: \$50/day

(Breakfast, lunch, and afternoon snack included in the price)

Monday, July 18th- *Dirt made my lunch!*-- Learn where our food comes from and how the dirt helps plants to grow healthy and strong. Discover the magic of composting and Wellspring's worm bins. Use tools to help tend to the gardens. Experience harvesting fresh veggies for meals and snacks!

Thursday, August 11th- *Nature Detective*-- Seeds become plants! Flowers turn into fruits! Compost turns into soil!! Who done it? And how?! Kids will get to be nature detectives for the week and explore how life unfolds on the farm. They'll use their spy skills to go on scavenger hunts, discover where food comes from, and learn about the world around them.

Seedlings (ages 10-13) Day Camps

Individual Day Camps (8 am- 5:30 pm) -- Cost: \$50/day

(except August 10)

(Breakfast, lunch, and afternoon snack included in the price)

Tuesday, July 19th- *Fantastic Farmers*-- Explore and interact with cycles of life on the farm, including plant life, soil life, and animal life. Kids learn how these cycles influence each other while discovering their place in the overall ecosystem. Kids will experiment with various ways of making compost and meet our chickens and their vegetables.

Wednesday, August 10th- *A-Buzz for Native Bees*-- Did you know honeybees are not native to North America? Who pollinated all the flowers in the U.S. before European settlers brought the honeybees here? Native bees are often overlooked, but they can be blue, green, brown or other colors and they usually build and live in nests rather than hives. Come see what the buzz is about native bees and actually build nests for them. We may even get to look at some beneath a microscope. **COST: \$60/day**

AgriCorps - 14 - 17 years

AgriCorps is a weeklong resident program for teens (ages 14 - 17) to learn business planning skills through organic farming.
