Welcome HOME (plus two “neighbors” - rural driveways within 2 miles of us) is looking for someone to plow (and when necessary) salt our driveways. Back to summer! The flowers are beautiful. Rhubarb is bountiful which means B&B guests are treated to fresh rhubarb crisp. Veggies are

planted in easy to reach from a wheelchair straw bales. Ground cherries are in pots on a screen porch hoping we will get the fruit this year. Last year the chipmunks beat us to all but a few ripe cherries. We know they had full bellies by the number of the paper-like wrappers (each individual fruit is enclosed in its own "package") we found every morning.

The Welcome HOME grounds are open to you. Once again the convenience of a wheelchair accessible porta-potty is made possible by the donation Welcome HOME received from the Newburg Lions Club. Hope this amenity makes your stroll through the Welcome HOME woods more enjoyable. It sure makes it much easier for group home or nursing home residents to come enjoy a leisurely picnic in the woods.

Bring a picnic. You'll find several wheelchair-friendly picnic tables around the grounds. Please take your trash home with you so we do not attract any more raccoons than we already share this space with.

Bring the kids. Relax on the park bench in the prairie while they run around the mowed paths in the prairie. Read a book from the Dolores T. Kornblum Memorial Little Free Library. The brown powder in the library is cinnamon. It discourages ants. The cinnamon won't harm you (the ants do bite) plus it makes the books smell good.

DO NOT BRING YOUR DOGS! The ONLY dogs allowed are Charlie and Dash (who live at Welcome HOME) and dogs (service dogs) of Welcome HOME guests.

PLEASE: (We ALL thank you for your consideration)

- No roller blades, skates, bikes.
- Do not remove anything (plant or animal - living or not) from the Welcome HOME grounds. This includes deer antlers that have been shed, flowers, fruit, frogs, salamanders, mushrooms...
- Stay on the trails. Avoid the POISON IVY.

Tours of Welcome HOME - a unique wheelchair accessible design home - are free of charge. Just contact us to schedule a time. We'll be glad to

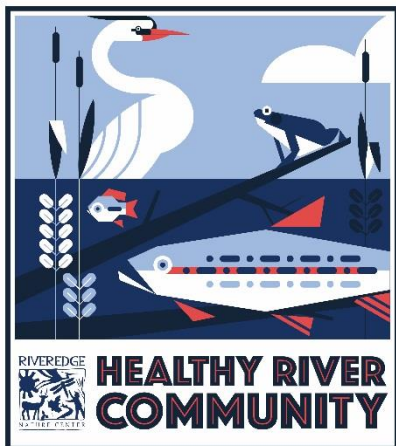
